Decolonizing HIV Care in 'Ōiwi Communities Pehea i hemo kolonaio ai iā kākou?

Colonization has had a devastating effect on native communities, including health impacts which can still be felt today. As Kanaka Maoli (Native Hawaiians), we understand that past traumas are closely related to current day circumstances. These connections, however, don't translate to numbers on a patient chart. This session will introduce participants to the history of colonization in the Hawaiian Islands and explore the theoretical foundations of "Post-Colonialism." Through this sociological lens, participants will have the opportunity to examine social determinants of health in Native Hawaiian communities. Potential problems and solutions in HIV care will be contextualized with an overview of Ke Ola Pono, a Native Hawaiian program serving people living with HIV. Participants will be asked to engage the material and share parallel experiences, challenges, and solutions to encourage robust discussion and problem-solving that all attendees can take back to their communities.

#iPrEPono: A Modern PrEP Campaign based on Indigenous Perspectives

In 2021, the Big Island of Hawai'i experienced the highest rate of new HIV infections in the State for the first time ever. This local epidemic moved our CBO, Kumukahi Health + Wellness, into immediate action and advocacy for an appropriate allocation of resources from our funders. While we had the capacity to take care of people living with HIV, we needed to create a new prevention message to get the word out to a very rural and isolated community facing even more new HIV transmissions. Our team came together and created an incredible campaign called "I PrEP P.O.N.O." Pono, a Native Hawaiian term meaning balance, became the central theme of our message, which grew into a large campaign which included posters, social media ads, commercials, and dating app advertisements featuring faces and voices of our local Hawaiian community. Because of this, our PrEP enrollment increased 210.3% and significantly decreased new HIV transmissions on our island.

We are the Medicine: Upholding Community Voices on HIV/AIDS through Indigenous Science and Storytelling

Amid the HIV/AIDS epidemic and the attempted erasure of Indigenous Peoples living with HIV across Canada, Two-Spirited Peoples have continued to mobilize and defend self-determination and public health sovereignty with a myriad of wholistic, community-driven responses. Firstly, through interdisciplinary and experiential health science, research, and activism, Mathew Fleury draw parallels between Indigenous methodologies and 'hard' science to examine the scientific and sociopolitical impacts of HIV/AIDS and Indigenous Peoples. In 'coming out' to disclose and draw upon their own lived experience as an Indigenous, Two-Spirited scholar recently diagnosed with HIV, Fleury critiques molecular HIV surveillance and the spaces that exist between the 'researcher' and 'researched'. Second, through a peer-led project, 'Healing Inner Voices', Morberg utilizes documentary storytelling to reduce stigma and build cultural safety. Lastly, Fleury and Morberg highlight initiatives like the 'Medicine Bundle' which aims to reclaim the spiritual aspects of sexuality by providing safer sex resources alongside traditional medicine.
